Transfiguration Transcript

September 2025

<u>Christians Share Compassion and Mercy with</u> Those Who Cause Their Own Problems

10 And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax collectors and sinners came and were sitting with him and his disciples. 11 When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" 12 But when he heard this, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. 13 Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners." (Matthew 9:10-13).

25 "Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. 26 He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. 27 He replied, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound.' 28 Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. 29 But he answered his father, 'Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. 30 But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!' 31 Then the father said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. 32 But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found.'" (Luke 15:25-32).

12 As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience (Colossians 3:12).

Some withhold compassion and mercy from those who cause their own problems. They do not feel sorry for those who cause their own problems because they believe those who cause their own problems should get what they deserve. They justify their lack of compassion and mercy as necessary; allowing those who cause their own problems to wallow in the messiness of their lives. They believe those who cause their own problems should be left to their natural consequences, so shame, need, and failure teach the hard lessons of life. Tough love is their mantra and watching others suffer in their problems vindicates their own lives properly lived.

If one analyzes the life of another; an incorrect, impetuous, not thought out, and/or self-ish decision will be found at the point a wrong turn is taken. As such, those who analyze the life of another to determine whether they deserve compassion and mercy will be able to condone their hardheartedness because they will discover where and why a wrong turn was taken; thereby, giving them permission to withhold compassion and mercy because they can blame the analyzed person for their problems.

Christians do not analyze another's life to determine whether that person deserves compassion and mercy. Instead, Christians are thankful for God's grace and share compassion and mercy with those who cause their own problems because Christians know they do not deserve the compassion and mercy they receive from God in Jesus.
