#### OME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER


- · Fabric should have no stains or holes.
- Pieces do not need to match in size or color/pattern as long as they fit into one of the three size options.
- Each spool of thread should match one of the pieces of fabric included. Neutral thread is also a good option.
- Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- $\bullet\,$  Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags

#### HOW TO PACK YOUR FABRIC KITS

 Wrap one piece of fabric and spools of thread inside the other piece of fabric, ensuring nothing will fall out. Secure with yarn, ribbon, string or rubber bands.

#### INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH FABRIC KIT

- TWO spools of neutral-colored, general purpose thread, 250-300 yards each
- TWO pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits of 100% polyester). Each piece should match one of the sizes below:
  - 2 ¼ yards of 60" wide fabric
  - 3 yards of 44" wide fabric
  - 4 yards of 36" wide fabric

# **Transfiguration Transcript**

# **July 2025**

#### It is My Privilege to be Your Pastor

It is my privilege to be your pastor, and I thank God for putting us together in partnership to do ministry for the last twenty years. Below is my newsletter article from May of 2014. I read it often to remind me of my place before God and the blessing it is to serve God by serving you as your pastor.

#### Note to Self

You are called as an ordained minister to the office of Word and Sacrament in the Church of Jesus Christ. You have been set apart to hold this office at Transfiguration Lutheran Church where you are in partnership with its members to glorify God. As such, it would serve you well to continually examine your call against the backdrop of King Saul in 1<sup>st</sup> Samuel.

Saul went out looking for donkeys and came back a king through no merit of his own. He was simply chosen by God to be the first king of Israel. Saul's only outstanding attributes were that he was tall and handsome. (You can claim only one of these attributes). Saul was reluctant, but the Spirit of God was with him. The well-being of Israel, not the well-being of Saul's kingship, was the primary concern of God. Consequently, Saul's kingship lasted for as long as he did not hinder Israel's well-being. Saul was faithful in much, saved Israel from its enemies, and was a very successful military leader.

The price of Saul's power was listening to God. Saul failed to listen to God by making an arrogant vow that was not in the best interest of Israel. Saul began acting on his own, making monuments to himself, thinking he was free, independent, a law unto himself, a power answerable to no one. He failed to give God deference, and in doing so, failed to keep covenant with God; thereby, hindering the well-being of Israel.

Finally, instead of listening to God, Saul chose to listen to the people in order to please them. Saul forgot that doing the will of the Lord was always in the best interest of the people even if the people disagreed. God therefore rejected Saul and took away his authority to lead.

The well-being of the Church of Jesus Christ is what's most important to God. It is not your pastorate. You have been called by God to the office of Word and Sacrament through no merit of your own. Like Saul, God's only demand of you is to listen. Therefore:

Do not be arrogant. Instead, be humble, thankful, and tenderhearted knowing that you are always answerable to God:

Know that your call is not dependent on pleasing people. Instead, it is dependent on your faithfulness to God's will; and

Know that if your pastorate hinders the well-being of the Church of Jesus Christ, you will be rejected by God, and God will take away your authority to lead.

As you move forward in your pastorate, remember the example of Saul. He was a successful king for a period of time, but in the end he was rejected, tormented, and stripped of all authority because he stopped listening to God.

You are only as faithful as your last sermon. You are only as faithful as your last pastoral visit. You are only as faithful as your last Bible study or confirmation class. You are only as faithful as your last committee or council meeting. Work hard. Let them see your love in your preparation. Never waste the time of the people you are privileged to serve as pastor with laziness, apathy, or indifference. Stay excited. Find your joy and self-esteem in your call. And, trust that the Spirit of God is with you, helping you, and providing blessing to you even when it is hard for you to notice.
